

Homecoming

The annual homecoming celebration today affords many American University alumni from distant points their first opportunity of witnessing the "new deal" team in action.

Though they have to date lost three of their six games, this new set of Eagles has displayed a brand of football that has never been seen before in an American University gridiron squad.

They opened the season by humbling a weak Bridgewater College eleven 60-0, here at Central Stadium. On October 5 they journeyed to Chestertown, Md., where they fell before a powerful Washington College eleven 41-14, though they outgained, outfought, and even outscored the Shoremen in the final three quarters. On October 12 they were in Farmville, Va., for their annual battle with Hampden-Sydney, which was lost by the margin of two points after touchdown. The first athletic relations with the United States Coast Guard Academy were successful for the Eagles, for they vanquished the Lifesavers by a 6-3 score. St. Johns College once again humbled the Eagles, but again it may be attributed to the inexperience of the American gridders in collegiate ball. Last Saturday they walked all over their traditional rivals from Gallaudet College by a 24-6 score, and today they will make a desperate bid to stop the undefeated Yellow Jackets from Randolph-Macon.

The prospects for next season are bright as but one man will be lost to Eagle ranks through graduation, and he has not appeared as a member of the varsity lineup this season. The backfield boasts of four freshmen and four sophomores, and the line is equally well equipped with young talent. The lack of experience which cost several ball games this season will not be noticeable, it is supposed, in the games in which these men will participate in the next two or three years.

American's faculty, alumni, and student body may, indeed, look for their institution to exhibit one of the finest small college teams in the country, within the next two or three years.







Menke first associated himself with American University athletics four years ago as line coach, and has remained in that capacity ever since. He is the donor of the Menke trophy for the "most valuable player" on Eagle gridiron squads; won last year by quarterback Staff Cassell.

Paul Smith, former Dickinson College basketball star and ex-coach of the Dickinson Seminary basketball team, came to American University a year ago from the latter institution. This fall he was appointed director of intramural athletics, in addition to his work as coach of the track team, assistant coach of the basketball squad, and his assist-
